THE FEDERAL INVESTMENT IN THE NATIONAL WRITING PROJECT -- KEY POINTS

- 1. THE NATIONAL WRITING PROJECT IS THE LARGEST AND LONGEST-STANDING TEACHER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM IN U.S. HISTORY.
- 2. THE NWP IS NOT JUST ANOTHER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT "PROJECT." IT IS A NATIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE OF 197 LINKED SITES, EACH OF WHICH IS A LOCAL SCHOOL-UNIVERSITY PARTNERSHIP.
- 3. FEDERAL FUNDING OF THE NWP IS NOT JUST ANOTHER ANNUAL "EXPENDITURE." IT IS AN <u>INVESTMENT</u> THAT IS COST EFFICIENT AND GENERATES EVER-EXPANDING CAPACITY TO SERVE TEACHERS.
- 4. THE FEDERAL INVESTMENT IN THE NWP INFRASTRUCTURE LEADS TO LARGE SCALE IMPROVEMENTS IN STUDENT WRITING.
- 5. FEDERAL FUNDING REMAINS CRITICAL TO THE NWP'S FUTURE WORK. FEDERAL FUNDING ENABLES THE INFRASTRUCTURE TO FUNCTION. A DISCONTINUITY IN FEDERAL FUNDING COULD PUT THE ENTIRE INFRASTRUCTURE, BUILT OVER 30 YEARS, AT RISK.

SUPPORTING POINTS AND DATA

- The NWP infrastructure has expanded its capacity and its service continually since 1974.
- In the past 32 years the NWP has grown from 1 site to 197 sites and has served an estimated 1.5 million teachers.
- NWP programs currently serve more than 90,000 teachers a year.
- Federal funding provides the core support necessary for effective federal-state-local partnerships.
- Over the past five years, every federal \$1.00 that goes to sites has leveraged \$3.34 additional dollars.
- Of the leveraged funds, 33% has come from local universities, 25% from local schools, 18% from states, and 24% from miscellaneous other sources.
- The NWP adheres to a teachers-teaching-teachers model that helps develop and disseminate expert teaching knowledge at a very large scale.
- Every year, about 1 out of every 35 teachers in the U.S. participates in a NWP program.
- Every summer, about 3,000 teachers participate in invitational institutes.
- On average, every teacher-consultant works with 15 other teachers in NWP programs.
- NWP programs are of high quality. Teachers value them and use what they learn in the NWP for the benefit of their students.
- 98% of teachers say that NWP institutes are better than other professional development they have attended.
- Teachers say that they gain concrete teaching strategies and up-to-date research; become motivated to keep learning more; and are better able to reach diverse students, assess student writing, and help students meet standards.
- The federal investment in the NWP infrastructure translates into improvement in writing for thousands of students.
- 98% of teachers say that what they learn translates into better writing skills for students.
- Participants in NWP institutes employ classroom practices that correlate with higher student achievement on writing and reading assessments of the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), the Nation's Report Card.
